



Abstract writing concepts come alive as students participate in a myriad of hands-on writing lessons.

Examples



Sentence Productions: Students are hired to be the stars, as well as action and set directors in order to “produce” a sentence.

Royal Word Presentations: Students present an enactment of a royal word to make it comprehensible to the kingdom.



Paragraph Bosses: Students meet different paragraph bosses to discover that topic sentences can appear in different places within a paragraph.

Sentence Dancing: Students learn the “rhythm” associated with various punctuation marks by dancing to different sentences using such marks.

Extra Baggage: Students are told that since every word in a group of sentences weighs 10 pounds, they must throw overboard unnecessary words (weighing down the work) to prevent the ship from sinking.

Frozen Sentences: Students race ice cubes to bring to life sentences with no action verbs.

Grammar Diseases: Students become grammar doctors who diagnose and cure patients with grammar diseases.
